ENTRY REQUIREMENTS / PRE-REQUISITES

- Applicants must be over the age of 18 to undergo licensing assessments
- Hold residency in Queensland, Australia
- Must present three (3) original evidence of identity documents
- Can use and interpret the English language that enables the safe performance of work
- Have sufficient literacy and numeracy skills
- Supply and wear PPE Clothing – long shirt, long pants, safety boots
- Have the physical lifting capabilities to apply slinging techniques
- Access to appropriate workplace, equipment and licensed dogman to supervise and sign-off on additional practical training (logbook hours)

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course specifies the outcomes required to perform slinging techniques, including the selection and inspection of lifting gear and/or the directing of the crane operator in the movement of the load when the load is out of view of the crane/ operator for licencing purposes. Content includes but is not limited too; planning the job, selecting and inspection equipment, prepare site and equipment, perform tasks, shut down job and clean up. This unit largely focuses on a practical training approach to ensure learners are provided with an engaging training experience and are well equipped to safely perform dogging tasks within the workplace.

Being a high-risk licencing unit, learners are required to undergo a series of training and assessments to be eligible to apply for a Workplace Health & Safety Queensland High-Risk Work Licence.

The course commences as 3-day face-to-face training sessions in which learners are provided with the required knowledge and skills. Upon successful completion of training, learners are required to attend a licensing theory assessment, as arranged with Century Training.

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After completion of training, learners will be required to achieve further practical training under the supervision of a person with the equivalent qualification. This training is to be recorded in a logbook. An individual's hours will vary and are determined during training. Maximum logbook hours issued are 120. It is the responsibility of the learner to source an appropriate workplace and licensed dogman to sign off on these hours. Learners are required to complete logbook hours within 12 months of undergoing training. Once the learner has successfully satisfied the required hours, a performance assessment is to be arranged with Century Training.

LICENCING ASSESSMENTS

Should a learner receive a *Not Yet Competent* result during any licencing assessment, they will be provided the opportunity to re-sit the assessment at a suitable time. Should a learner cancel an assessment with limited notice, a re-assessment fee may apply.

COURSE OUTCOME

Upon the successful completion of Training, Licensing Theory Assessment, Additional Practical Training and Licensing Performance Assessment, the learner will be issued a nationally recognised Statement of Attainment and the required paperwork to apply for a Workplace Health & Safety High-Risk Licence class, DG.

OBTAINING A LICENCE

Learners are required to submit an online application to Workplace Health & Safety Queensland whom will issue a high-risk work licence. This application must be lodged within 60 days after the date of the successful assessment. Any additional fees associated with this licencing requirement are at the expense of the applicant. Century Training will provide further instructions on this process upon completion of training.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Workplace Health and Safety does not allow full RPL of high risk licences. All learners must complete the *Licensing Theory and Performance Assessments*. However, if suitable documented evidence is provided of prior operations, the applicant may be able to use that evidence to modify the training needed to achieve competency. Century Training in conjunction with Workplace Health & Safety require sufficient and current evidence of this experience. Expired licences and licences from overseas jurisdictions are not recognised for full RPL, the assessment process must still occur. Enquire for further information on RPL.

LANGUAGE, LITERACY & NUMERACY SUPPORT (LLN)

Language, literacy and numeracy requirements for this course require the learner to be able to read, comprehend and write a limited range of texts in a familiar context. It also requires the learner to carry out basic mathematical calculations. Century Training offers strategies to assist learners who may require support in these areas. Should a learner feel they may require assistance in these areas, please notify the Training Coordinator prior to enrolment to discuss these options further.
